Overview of GSA's Mentor Programs

Geology in Government Mentor Luncheon

An interactive event which connects geoscience professionals from the government sectors to GSA's student members. The Q&A panel platform for this career information exchange includes a free lunch for both students and mentors. This year 350 students will attend this event.

Geology in Industry Mentor Luncheon

Offers a FREE lunch for 300 undergraduate and graduate students. This event held at GSA's Annual Meeting features a select panel of mentors representing various industries. These mentors invite questions from the students, offer advice about preparing for a career, and comment on the prospects for current and future job opportunities within their organizations.

Mann Mentors in Applied Hydrogeology

The Mann Programs are held at both GSA Section Meetings and GSA's Annual Meetings. They provide opportunities for students interested in hydrogeology to meet, connect with, and learn from professionals employed in the field. Informal, but focused, career sessions are held over a light meal at GSA's Section Meetings. For our Annual Meeting, the Mann Program underwrites the cost for up to 25 students to attend GSA's prestigious Hydrogeology Division Business and Awards Banquet. These programs impact approximately 250 students per year.

Shlemon Mentor Programs in Applied Geoscience

The Shlemon Programs extend the mentoring reach of individual professionals from applied geoscience to undergraduates and graduate students attending GSA Section Meetings. Over free lunches, mentors and students discuss professional opportunities and challenges that await them beyond their graduation. Over the course of a season, 350+ students will be mentored by 80+ professionals.

Women in Geology Mentor Program

A new mentoring program sponsored by Subaru will address the issues faced by women in geology. This social hour will begin with a few key female speakers, followed by a relaxing forum for socializing, sharing ideas and meeting other women in geology. This program will impact approximately 100 women.
