EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The International Division is service oriented rather than discipline oriented, and its mission is to coordinate and sponsor activities related to geology beyond North America; to serve as a focal point of exchange of North American geoscientists working overseas; to raise funds for partial travel support of foreign colleagues to participate in geoscience activities, and to strengthen cooperation with other geological organizations around the world. The total range of chronologic activities listed below fully represent the various elements of the ID mission.

INTERNATIONAL DIVISION (ID) ACTIVITIES DURING 2006

1. ID provided \$2,000 financial support for the April 3-7 International Conference in Mendoza, Argentina entitled *The Backbone of America from Patagonia to Alaska*; a sister session had been part of the GSA Annual Session in 2005 at Salt Lake City with conveners S. Kay and M. Cloos.

2. ID worked with the GSA Foundation Office to conduct a donation drive, the purpose of which was to secure additional funds to be used to support the travel and meeting attendance of various international students and researchers. The drive netted more than \$5,000.

3. ID was provided by GSA, partly as a result of the success of the above drive, with \$11,810 to be used to provide support for international participation at the 2006 GSA meeting. The following eleven geoscientists were partially supported by ID to present their papers:

4. ID has an agreement with the 9-country Coordinating Committee for Geoscience Programmes in East and Southeast Asia (CCOP). The GSA Foundation provides up to \$5,000 annually from the East Asian Geoscience and Environmental Research (EAGER) Fund (established in 2003 by

Ric Terman of ID) as a grant to a PhD candidate selected by the host country of the CCOP Annual Session. This year the 2005 EAGER Project awardee, Dr Zhen Li received additional partial travel support monies from ID to give her paper at the GSA session which was a summary of her doctoral dissertation on the *Palynology of the Red River Delta of Vietnam*.

5. ID nominated Prof. Eldridge M. Moores for the 2006 Distinguished Career Award of the GSA International Division. Council approved and announced it at the October 21 Award ceremony.

6. ID hosted a successful business meeting with about 35 attendees at noon on October 23 2006.

- Yildirim Dilek reviewed the past activities and introduced the travel awardees (see 3); each made a brief statement.
- Ric Terman reviewed the EAGER Award and introduced last year's winner (see 4).
- Yildirim Dilek gave a citation for Eldridge Moores (see 5) as the winner of the ID Distinguished Career Award; the Professor responded eloquently.
