- Comply with GSA's Events Code of Conduct.



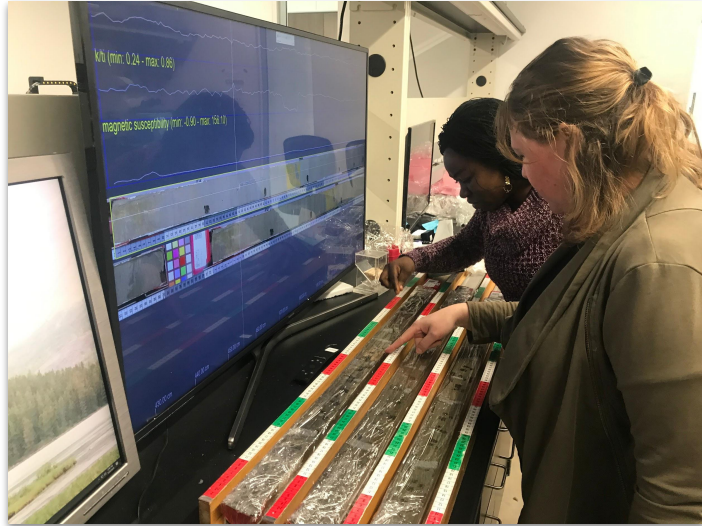
Land Acknowledgment
